Dear Friends

Single track roads can teach valuable lessons! From the narrow road between Duirinish and Kyle of Lochalsh, where we holidayed after Easter, there are stunning views of the sea, of Skye, Raasay and other tiny islands. But it is so narrow that every so often there are designated passing places to allow someone in a hurry behind to overtake. The pause can give some moments of wonder at all there is to see.

Leaving these parishes at the end of this month, is a bit the same. It has always been part of the plan that, at the end of the re-organisation of parishes, I would step aside to enable the eight parishes to choose their new vicar.

Pausing to write gives me the moments to see, not only the physical beauty of these villages, but also the encouragement and the possibilities that abound in the people. For the vast majority are just that - 'can do' people - risk takers, generous-hearted people who see the potential in others, and in situations in their village. Graveyards are tidied voluntarily, animals are blessed, youngsters can be trusted to lead services with integrity, ancient churches can be given a loo or a kitchen, beautiful music can fill a stunning and simple building, vulnerable people can be supported and potential encouraged with delight. Indeed, my eyes have seen countless examples of the love of Jesus being acted out quietly - and noisily - in every one of our villages.

Thank you for your care and encouragement of me! It has been an honour to minister here for ten years. As I move into the 'passing place', I will cherish countless conversations, laughter and tears, as I look back at the wonder of these Suffolk villages and their people.

Process of Choosing a New Vicar

This is well under way. The group of eight parishes has to produce a kind of advertising booklet, called a Benefice Profile. This has a description of each village and church, and also has a kind of 'wish list' for what you would like in the new vicar. People from each church have been getting together to write this, and at a meeting in June, began to pull it into one document. On Monday, September 2nd, all the council members from each of the eight churches will meet in Laxfield church and present this document to Archdeacon Ian, who will take it to the Bishop. As soon as it is deemed finished, it also goes to other patrons of the churches, and then the post is advertised.

We hope that the advertisement will appear in the autumn, and then interviews will take place. A priest obviously has to work out some notice in their current parishes.....and then move here! My best guess is that there will be a new vicar at some point in the new year. Meanwhile, there are the Revd Ron and Canon Graham and the churchwardens and elders who will continue to serve the benefice.

New Players Needed



We are trying to make the fair as traditional as possible with lots of fun, activities & prizes for both adults & children, which includes:



They were handsomely entertained by the Classic Dixieland Trio whilst the children present were well provided for with a Fancy Dress Competition, a bouncy castle and coconut shy in the car park, and at the end of the day with a Punch and Judy Show. We were carefully guided through the proceedings by Nick Hopkins as MC, which included a loyal toast, a sturdy rendering of the national anthem and a showing of the Pathé News recording of the actual coronation in 1953. Marian Ward kindly organised the raffle which brought the event to a close.

Our Guest of Honour, Fiona Newton remarked that not only was a feast provided (with delicious quiches, sausage rolls, cheeses, bread, coronation chicken, salads and a magnificent array of puddings and sweets) but it was a real community event. The Organising Committee are most grateful to everyone who helped make this such a memorable, joyful and successful day: bringing food, buying wine, helping set up and dismantle tables, providing floral decorations, preparing the china and glasses, laying tables, running the bar, decorating the hall, serving tea and coffee, washing up, judging the Fancy Dress Competition, providing prizes, supervising the outdoor activities, showing the newsreel and many other forms of practical help. Were you in Wilby in June 2013?

On 2nd June we celebrated the 60th year of the Queen's Coronation, and on 8th June, the beginning of the building of the Coronation Hall. Many people poured into the hall for both occasions which were organised by two hard working committees. Some people came to both events. On 2nd June the lunch was delicious, with a wide selection of food brought along by each family. Chatting, eating and dancing all happened in time to music played by "The Dixieland Band". The children and adults found plenty to entertain them – a coconut shy, a bouncy castle, "Punch and Judy", fancy dress etc. On 8th June one descendant of the original builders wrote:-

“ On behalf of the family of George Fayers (1975 volunteer), we would like to congratulate and thank you and all the other organisers for yesterday's wonderful celebrations that the family enjoyed. We felt immensely privileged and proud to have been a part of it, knowing our Dad and Grandad played a part in its creation. My parents loved ballroom dancing and were often seen at Wilby dancing to the Charles Ray band, enjoying the social life and friendships it inevitably created. Unfortunately, their dancing days came to an abrupt end when my Dad suffered a brain haemorrhage in his late 50s, rendering him disabled and without speech (so hard for someone who loved his social life). I'm positive both my parents were so proud to have been a part of Wilby Hall's history, and we thank you again for making it so memorable. Many thanks from all the Fayers Family”

Chairman of the County Council, Guy McGregor and his wife presented the crowns in black velvet boxes, each containing a concise history of the hall. Victor Warne had the bright idea of writing the history and gathering all the people together. Two cars from the 1950s stood at the entrance, photographs were taken, a film was made, and school children sang and played brass instruments. Tea was prepared by the Ladybirds and Janice Knights, daughter of a 1953 builder, George Flounders, made and gave a celebration cake cut by Jeffrey Morton, the only member alive from 1953/55 build. Magicians, comedians and line and zumba dancers gave demonstrations to keep everyone amused. A farewell presentation was made to thank Canon Fiona Newton for all her work in Wilby.

M.C. Roger Griffith confidently guided us through the event. The evening was completed by a well-attended social dance. All who helped worked until they dropped and are to be thanked. Fine weather blessed us on both days. Thank you to all who gave pleasure to so many. **Marian Ward.**

2nd June 2013—A Watershed for Wilby

Watersheds come and go, milestones are passed, great events occur and we may, once they are gone, never reflect on what life was like before.

One such event occurred in Wilby as recently as 2nd June this year, which also happened to be the 60th anniversary of Queen Elizabeth II's coronation, and this event was no minor thing. You would, though, later in the day, have joined in the robustly enthusiastic whoops, howls and cheers for the vagaries of the (slightly dubious) relationships between Punch, Judy, the Baby and The Law! And all but three of you were probably sad when you didn't walk off the stage with a Prize-winners cup for the 'Heroes' fancy dress competition. But no matter – out in the car park, there was always B.C. and his good friend Coconut Shy, to put things back in perspective. (You all looked 'awesome' in your outfits by the way).

Speaking for myself, the toe-tapping jazz band, wonderful raffle prizes (someone carried off a cake on a stand fit for a queen!) and FREE champers with which to toast Her Majesty made this a 'great event' to be remembered at all costs, if for no other reason than that we could, if we can find another good excuse, do it all again next year. Church Close Housing Development

An informal meeting was held on 19th June 2013 to discuss the proposed Church Close Housing development. Called by Orwell Housing Association, it was attended by them, their architect, Mid Suffolk District Council Housing officials, six Parish Councillors and District Councillor Stuart Gemmill. Orwell confirmed its intention to re-submit for planning consent for 10 affordable homes on the Church Close site. The housing officials reported that there are 39 registered applicants in the Stradbroke, Laxfield, Hoxne and Wilby area, and explained the allocation process, the proposed tenancies and their management by Orwell.

Parish Councillors expressed concern that there had been virtually no change to the original proposals despite stating that the number of affordable houses proposed was disproportionate in a small village like Wilby, and that the PC had received no proof of the local need to support this number. Also the issue of pedestrian safety remained to be resolved. The PC had recently written to the chief planning official at Mid Suffolk restating its objections to the Orwell scheme and suggesting that a mixed development of affordable homes, starter homes for private rent or ownership and houses for the elderly or those with special needs would be more appropriate and acceptable. A formal response was awaited but, from discussion at the meeting, it was apparent that the DC were intent on progressing the 10 affordable homes scheme because of their priority for affordable housing, the lengthy waiting list, the opportunity provided by the ownership of the Church Close site and the availability of grant to Orwell towards the costs of the scheme.

The meeting concluded that the higher level interests and priorities of the DC were at variance with the interests and views of the local community. In the meantime it was probable that Orwell would re-submit for planning approval for the ten affordable house scheme. The PC and residents would have the opportunity to comment on the proposals, and these comments would be brought to the attention of the Planning Committee considering

the application. In addition the Parish Council and representatives of the community (for and against the proposal) would have the opportunity to attend and speak at the planning hearing .

The Church Close Housing Development will be on the agenda of the next Parish Council meeting to be held on 3rd July 2013 in the Coronation Hall, at which Councillors would be pleased to hear views from the community, and in particular the residents of Church Close, so that these can be taken into account in formulating the Parish Council's response to the future planning submission.
