Dear Friends

There was a euphoria that leaped from radio and television. On the air it was announced that 'extra time has been given to the sports news!' Why? Because last month, The Ryder Cup was won by the European team. The Captain said these words: "*We all have to die. But today, I have learned to live*"

I don't think it was golf that prompted an early saint, Ignatius, to say "*the Glory of God is a man or woman fully alive.*"

'Alive' is such a powerful word. Last month, I spent a few days at Ditchingham in south Norfolk, helping to run a conference for priests from both Norfolk and Suffolk. One man - and his dog - made a lasting impression on me. Canon Simon Stokes is blind. To some extent, Tigger his dog enables him to 'live'. But actually, it is Simon's own determination to '*be alive and live it to the full*' that enables him to stride out around his parishes, to travel to India to preach, to jump out of aircraft to raise money for the disabled.

Even when Tigger was off harness and exercising, Simon still walked with confidence, all his senses alert to the sound of any approaching traffic, or unevenness underfoot. He has indeed '*learned to live*'.

News from the Parish Council

The Parish Council meeting on 3rd October was quite brief, finishing at 8.24pm.

The Police had sent a written report: locally, there was a theft of heating oil from a property in Wootton Green towards the end of September; generally, the police are warning members of the public to be aware of the increasing incidence of Identity Theft and Identity Fraud.

Concerns were raised about the exit from the land at the rear of Church Close onto the Stradbroke road; the motorist's view towards Stradbroke is obscured by plants in the grass verge at the front of Nos 16 and 18. The parish clerk will report the problem to the appropriate authority.

It was reported that one of the School Community Governors has resigned. It is anticipated that the school will be advertising for a new Community Governor shortly.

The Parish Clerk had received an email from the MSDC Planning Officer dealing with the application for the land at the rear of Church Close.

Orwell Housing has acknowledged the comments made by the Parish Council and others and is proposing to amend the plans, although the original application has not been withdrawn. When the amended plans are available the Planning Officer hopes to arrange an informal meeting with the Parish Council.

Councillors wished to make generally available the correspondence and other material which they consider as part of their duties. Accordingly, this

has now been placed on the Wilby website (www.wilby.onesuffolk.net). It can be accessed by going to the Parish Council page and selecting Correspondence. Members of the public are very welcome to attend the next Parish Council meeting which will be in Coronation Hall at 7.30pm on Wednesday 7th November.



To whoever abandoned their cat and five kittens in a Wilby gateway on 19th October 2012

Perhaps you will take some time to reflect on the consequences of your decision to abandon your cat and her kittens that Thursday evening. Thankfully the owner of the land on which you left them found the wooden box of starving, wet, cold kittens and got them to a vet in time. Sadly, nothing could be done to save your cat, strangled by the white string with which you tied her to the fence. Perhaps you'll think back to where this all started, when you took responsibility for an animal that you failed to have spayed, taking advantage of the free neutering vouchers that could have prevented her pregnancy. Perhaps you'll ask yourself why you allowed her to produce five kittens and then threw them out of their home at four weeks old. And why you separated your cat from her babies? Perhaps you'll be grateful to the numerous people who are now dealing with the fallout from your actions:

The land owner, who found your strangled cat, revived your starving kittens and took them to the vets. The vet who provided continued emergency care for the five soaking wet, freezing kittens to ensure that they survived their ordeal.

The person who is bottle feeding those orphaned kittens round the clock to make up for the loss of their mother's milk. The volunteers who will ensure that the kittens will be homed with responsible owners who cherish life. The organisation that responsibly disposed of your cat's body offering her some dignity in death. The fundraisers who stand out in all weathers collecting the money to enable all of the above to happen. The people who will read this and despair of humanity when they learn of your callous behaviour. Your friends and relatives whose lives you touch daily, who don't know what you are capable of, and would be ashamed to be associated with you if they did know.

Perhaps you're glad there are others who think entirely differently from you; those people who take responsibility. You may not care for animals, but perhaps you'll acknowledge the people whose lives you affected when you acted that night?

Your 'problem' is off your hands, but that Thursday night you replaced your 'problem' with a responsibility that no one else in the world shares, namely the death of your poor strangled cat who paid for your decisions and disgraceful actions with her life. (Name and address withheld).
