I was really excited! Justin, the vicar who trained me as a curate, began his Pilgrimage of Prayer in our very own region. He stood on the top of the steps outside the Forum in Norwich. It certainly wasn't St Peter's Square. And he certainly is not the Pope.....but there must have been a thousand people gathered to listen to him being interviewed.

He hasn't changed. Our new Archbishop has a gift of informed and informal communication. He loves this area, and knows it well from childhood holidays. He knows how much food is produced here, and what pockets of real hardship there are. He knows its beauty - for he loves the sea - and he knows both the friendliness and reserve of the inhabitants. He knows too, the pain and challenges and joys of family life. All of that came across.

But what also was clear was his passion for a simple message. It was this: that changed lives are possible when people re-connect with God. That when we pray together, we are drawn together, and are changed by that contact with God.

As he and Caroline his wife moved with the crowd towards the Cathedral, passers-by were handed a small candle, and a card with a prayer. Here it is for you too:

**Lord, your light is hope and comfort in this cold world.
As it burns, let my fears be melted by your love.
Lord, your presence with me is promised and faithful.
As this light fades, let me know your unchanging fire in my heart.
Lord, this flame is to light other candles. May I be peace and love to
those around me. Amen**





Vicarage Secretary Needed

Due to Lizzie Smyth being offered a full time position elsewhere, the vacancy has arisen for a part-time Administrator for the eight parishes of our benefice. The role is for 3 hours a week, at £9.00 an hour. Based at the Vicarage in Laxfield, the job includes producing the services' rota and the monthly newsletter. This requires a knowledge of Microsoft Publisher, Excel and Word, together with an understanding of the Church of England. The successful applicant would also be responsible for the management of the financial account of the eight parishes. The role includes time working alone as well as happily relating to others who come to the vicarage. Interviews will be on Wednesday May 1st, and letters of application, together with a CV, should arrive at the vicarage by April 23rd.

News From the Parish Council

The Parish Council held its bi-monthly meeting on 6th March 2013. The minutes of the meeting will be published on the Village website (www.wilby.onesuffolk.net and follow the links to Parish Council) as will documentation received by the Council on a range of civic matters. The following matters were discussed:

Church Close Housing Development

District Councillor Stuart Gemmill reported that Orwell Housing Association are considering submitting a further application for planning approval to develop the Church Close site. Before submission to the District Council, however, it was intended to have consultation with the Parish Council and with residents to consider and seek support for any new proposal. As the original Orwell scheme is not now going ahead, the District Council was drawing up new proposals for resolution of the long standing sewage problem affecting existing Church Close houses.

Planning/Listed Building Applications

By majority votes the Council supported applications to place PV panels on the rear of The Old Forge, to extend the garden area at the planned Church Farm development opposite the Village Hall, and to divert a foot-path in Foals Green, with appropriate comments in each case.

Local Authority Funding

Council noted that there was £4,000 earmarked for the village hall and £3,600 available for outdoor sports provision, arising from the contributions made by developers (associated with the level of provision of affordable housing in private developments).

Neighbourhood Planning

It was becoming increasingly clear that the costs of preparing a Neighbourhood Plan would be substantial and that little support, financial or otherwise, would be available from the District Council. In the circumstances the Parish Council heard an informal proposal that, as an interim measure, a village plan should be developed to provide a context for the consideration of planning applications. This idea will be considered further and, if implemented, would involve detailed consultation with the community to determine how the village should be developed, what facilities would be desirable etc.

Annual Parish Meeting

The Annual Parish Meeting for 2013 will be held in the Village hall at 7pm on Wednesday 1st May 2013. Invitations will be sent to organisations within the village (School, Church, Village Hall, WI etc) to attend and give a brief account of their activities in the previous year. This is not only an opportunity for the community to hear what has been happening in the village but also for individuals to ask questions, make their own comments and put forward proposals about matters affecting the village. The Parish Council therefore warmly encourages everyone to attend.

Wilby WI

In December we enjoyed a delicious Christmas meal at Brundish Crown. The January meeting was cancelled due to bad weather. In February we were shown how to make birthday and Christmas cards etc. We were amazed at how many wonderful things can be purchased for this, and the end product was very professional. Five guests attended this meeting, and it was great to see some new faces. Hopefully they didn't find us too frightening and will return! The April meeting will be on Thursday 18th, with Mrs Dearlove giving a talk on Ocean Children. **Nancy Morton**

This year's meeting will take place in the church at 8pm on Monday, 29th April. Anyone who is a member of the church via the Electoral Roll is invited to attend.

Brundish Spring Clean

As part of the annual countywide drive to reduce litter, we are once again hoping to organise a Spring Clean of the village. As in previous years, there will be a main day when as many volunteers as possible get together for a couple of hours to blitz the roads in the village, but also an opportunity for anyone who wants to help but can't attend on the day. The main push will be on Saturday 13th April, meeting at the Village Hall at 9.45am. Volunteers will be able to collect bags, plus litter picker and high-vis jacket if required (bring your own if you have them!) and will be assigned a patch. Obviously, the more volunteers we have, the more ground we will be able to cover. The aim will be to clear the B1118, from Foals Green Road right through to Frostley Bridge; Tannington Long Road; The Street; also the smaller lanes such as Church Lane and the far end of The Street around Woodlands Farm and Lane Farm. We will work for a couple of hours, with

the intention of finishing at the pub! Our full bags will be collected from the roadside and taken to a point where they will later be collected by the District Council Waste Team. Last year, just four of us managed to collect eight full bags of rubbish from the main roads of the village, plus more was picked up by other volunteers elsewhere in the week either side of our main event. If you want to help but can't commit to that Saturday morning, you are very welcome to take on a little stretch at another time near the day – but please let me know, so we can deploy our pickers efficiently on the day! It would also help to know in advance who is likely to turn up so I can ensure we have enough equipment. Email brundishparishclerk@msn.com or give me a call on 01728 628607.

We are very lucky in that there are a few dedicated people who regularly pick up litter around their own area, but sadly we do suffer from 'drive by littering' – mucky folk who chuck their rubbish out of car windows as they drive through – and this annual Spring Clean helps to keep things under control. A trip of a Lifetime

For George Austin of The Street, Brundish, a very special adventure is about to happen. Two years ago the 1st Fressingfield Scout & Explorer Group Kenya Exchange Project - 2013 linked up with Mother's Mercy Home in Kenya which offers shelter and education to orphans around Nairobi. The 1st FS&EG are planning to strengthen their links further by setting up an International Exchange. In April 2013 a team of 10 Explorer Scouts (16-17 year olds) and three Scout Leaders will fly out and spend two weeks at MMH, working around the home, on the farm, teaching English, redecorating the school house and leading a camping trip (UK scouting style) for the orphans into the African bush!

The 1st FS&EG further intend to invite four of their Kenyan friends back to the UK in the Summer 2013, including one week on Summer Camp in the UK and one week with host families locally. The 1st FS&EG's aim is to maintain and develop further their annual sponsorship of MMH, and hope that the Exchange will take place every three years.

George Austin is one of the 10 Explorer Scouts making this trip in April - upon their return, the Team/Group plan to do a Kenya Presentation of the trip - details of this presentation will be advertised.

Roger Limbrick 1933 - 2013



The talented designer and artist Roger Limbrick has died on the 17th February, aged 79. During his life he was a familiar figure in both the design and education fields, having held key positions at four London Design schools where he was well respected in each institution by students and staff alike, renowned for his energy, enthusiasm and humour. Roger was a Londoner by birth but spent his formative years in Sussex. In 1952 he attended the Worthing School of Art. This was followed by two years as a national serviceman on the Suez Canal and in Cyprus, and three years at The Royal College of Art studying textile design.

It was in textiles that he first made his mark with bold, colourful designs produced by Hull Traders and Heals, among others. Roger and his first wife, fellow artist Kathleen May, lived in Chiswick, West London, with their five children. He developed an interest in toy design with an emphasis on using natural materials, revelling in the notion of 'play' and fascinated by its consequences, he often used his children to test his ideas and innovations. His work in the 60's saw him winning the Galt Toys Competition with his Open-side Doll's House, still exhibited in the Victoria & Albert Museum. In 2012 his early work was featured in the Museum of Modern Art 'Century of the Child' exhibition in New York, where his innovative cardboard design from 1967 'Space Rocket' slotted beautifully into the space exploration section. In 1969 Roger became Senior Tutor

for Furnishing Textiles at the London College of Furniture, and ten years later he was appointed in the same role at the Royal College of Art until staff redundancies were imposed in 1984 as a result of the Thatcher cuts.

He continued working as a designer outside his teaching commitments, and when he moved to Brundish in 1982 with his new partner, the designer Marion Hine, he quickly warmed to his new surroundings. Life in the north Suffolk countryside suited him - the green revolution was at its zenith. Together they set about developing ideas for the art/education market through their design consultancy Hine & Limbrick, whose achievements included originating and designing successful ranges of products to popularise science and creativity for children. Later they started the Suffolk based company Crafty Devils! with Marion's sister Jessica, aimed at bringing the craft and design experience to a wider junior audience. These enterprises kept them engaged for almost three decades.

Roger loved to entertain, but listening to a Limbrick story was no mean feat. Accounts of exploits could be so convoluted one could lose the will to live with their telling. During his last few years, Roger moved gently into new creative experiences as an abstract painter, drawing inspiration from the Suffolk landscape. He particularly enjoyed rediscovering the medium of collage and the making of small sculptural objects using recycled materials. He explored new technology through the medium of digital art by exhibiting every year from 2003 in the International Mini-Print Exhibition, a travelling show that also visits Wingfield Arts in Suffolk.

His contribution to art education and his recognition of the innate creativity of the child remains hugely significant. All who had the privilege to know him and work with him will fondly remember a colourful man and a productive, imaginative life.

Roger is survived by his partner Marion, his four sons Simon, Mark, Timothy and Matthew and his daughter Rachel.
