Dear Friends,

The snowdrops are out! Daffodils are getting ready to bloom! Garden plants are beginning to grow again.

And Lent is here, with Easter to come. I am always challenged by what to 'do' differently during Lent. The snowdrops have given me an idea.

They stay hidden for such a long while, taking in nutrients from the earth and - almost secretly - dividing underground and multiplying. Then, in these darkest days, they peep above the ground and do what they do best - they are snowdrops. They give me hope....that the rhythm of life and death has once again turned its circle, and that I, like they, need these days to replenish my soul and grow deeper in my faith.

So I have bought Stephen Cottrell's new book, *Christ in the Wilderness*. Bishop Stephen is the motor-bike riding bishop of Chelmsford. I suspect therefore, he can teach me a thing or two from his risky living, and show me how to journey more deeply into wisdom, and to understand more fully how Jesus lived, how Jesus died, and how Jesus became something entirely new. Here's a prayer that I like for this time of year:

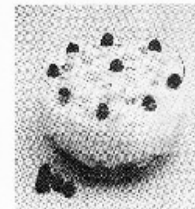

## Church Close Housing Development

The Planning Committee B of Mid Suffolk District Council met on 30th January 2013 to consider the application from Orwell Housing Association to build 10 affordable homes on the land to the rear of Church Close. The Parish Council having recommended refusal of the application, the Committee received late submissions from the Highways Department of Suffolk County Council and English Heritage, both recommending that planning permission be refused; the former on pedestrian and road safety grounds and the latter since the proposed housing would change the existing pattern of development and would negatively affect the setting of St Mary's Church, a Grade I listed building.

The Committee heard a report from their officials changing their initial recommendation from acceptance to refusal in the light of the submissions from Highways and English Heritage. Representations against the application were heard from Todd Strehlow on behalf of the Parish Council and from Ian Williamson as a neighbouring proprietor. The project architect spoke in favour of the application. The ward Councillor, Stuart Gemmill, indicated a lack of support from local residents for the development. The Committee, having made various individual observations, unanimously agreed to refuse the application for planning permission. The future of the site now remains uncertain pending a review of the situation by Mid Suffolk District Council and Orwell Housing Association.

## Louie Baker 1914-2013

Louisa Violet Baker, better known as Louie, died on 25th January aged 98. She was born on 2nd March, 1914, so just missed her 99th birthday. Her great niece, Clare Tapp, remembers a kind, gentle and generous woman who dedicated her life to her employers, and later to the young people around Wilby and Stradbroke. By today's standards her life was hard, but she never complained about the absence of physical and material comforts.



As a young girl she went into service, working among other places at Wilby Manor, and Wilby Rectory, now Wilby House. This latter job involved looking after Canon Marriott, which she did virtually single-handedly until he died. During her 30s Louie became engaged to a village man, but nothing came of this. At around the same time, when she was just 32, she took over running the Wilby branch of the Girls' Friendly Society from Mrs Marriott when she died in 1946. Louie built the group up from three girls to seventeen, and many of these 'girls' remained her friends for life. She was also a helper at the playgroup in Stradbroke until well into her 80s. A surprise party thrown by the youngsters for her 80th birthday was photographed for the EADT. Louie moved into Rectory Lodge in 1969, and remained there until her death. Canon Marriott's niece, Ann, was a close friend, although this relationship only developed in their later years. They meant a great deal to each other, and the two would walk the path to each other's door at least twice a day, in snow and by torchlight, just to "check in" on each other. Louie missed Ann very much when she died. Her faculties were sharp right to the end, and on her table were crossword and sudoku puzzles which she enjoyed completing; her memory was phenomenal. Her great niece Clare said: "In her living years Nanny would have hated being centre of attention - she was a modest and private person. But I am sure that now, she would be touched by all the tributes people have paid her, for how wonderful and touching her farewell service was, and even for her little moment of celebrity on passing away as the oldest resident in Wilby".

## Brundish Spring Clean

As part of the annual county-wide drive to reduce litter, we are once again hoping to organise a Spring Clean of the village. As in previous years, there will be a main day when as many volunteers as possible get together for a couple of hours to blitz the roads in the village, but also an opportunity for anyone who wants to help but can't attend on the day. The main push will be on **Saturday 13<sup>th</sup> April**, meeting at the Village Hall at 9.45 am. Volunteers will be able to collect bags, plus litter picker and high-vis jacket if required (bring your own if you have them!) and will be assigned a patch. Obviously, the more volunteers we have, the more ground we will be able to cover. The aim will be to clear the B1118, from Foals Green Road right through to Frostley Bridge; Tannington Long Road; The Street; also the smaller lanes such as Church Lane and the far end of The Street around Woodlands Farm and Lane Farm. We will work for a couple of hours, with the intention of finishing at the pub! Our full bags will be collected from the roadside and taken to a point where they will later be collected by the District Council Waste Team.
