Dear Friends,

Aside from being St David's day, the first of this month, Ash Wednesday, starts the season of Lent which leads up to Easter. As I am sure you already know, Lent is the 40-day period of abstinence and reflection, marking the 40 days of fasting and temptation of Jesus in the wilderness. This is an aspect of Jesus that is wonderfully human, that he had to face many temptations and keep himself pure before taking up the task of saving us from ourselves. Whether you believe that temptation comes from the devil, or from within ourselves, it is a fact of life that we face every day and it is an unavoidable part of our human vulnerability. Unfortunately, we live in a world which all too often seeks to exploit that vulnerability for its own ends, or as St Peter put it: Your enemy the devil, like a roaring lion, is on the prowl looking for someone to devour! (1 Peter 5:8) Lent finishes on the day before Easter Sunday, and this often results in somebody pointing out to me that 40 days from Ash Wednesday doesn't go all the way to Easter eve – and they are right! It's because we traditionally do not include Sundays as a fasting day.

In recent years, the idea of 'giving up something for Lent' has been extended to taking up something charitable instead – opportunities abound, there are no end of people and charities who could use your help and it doesn't need to finish at Easter, as Jesus once said, you will always have the poor with you.

Another important day this month is Mothering Sunday i.e. March 26th so please check your church's notice board for special services, along with other events your church may be running to mark Lent and/or to support various charities.

Finally, David is running a Lent course on the 9th, 16th, 23rd and 30th March at 2pm in the Rectory. If you can, please do some along – I promise that there will be no 'deep theology'.

NEWS FROM WILBY CEVC PRIMARY SCHOOL

A note from Headteacher Mrs Wiseman

Healthy Wilby!

The pupils of Wilby Primary School set the example for everyone in 2017 by kick-starting the new year with a two week fun-packed 'Healthy-me' project. The topic, which was studied at all three key-stages will be wide-ranging, focussing in on current issues such as the importance of daily exercise, the need to reduce sugar intake and the importance of a healthy balanced diet.

A number of visitors were invited into school including a dietitian, personal gym and fitness trainer and a British Handball Association coach each have or will work with the children in a variety of ways in order to bring their learning alive. The two weeks also incorporated an enterprise challenge - to design, market and create a food for a healthy lunch-box. The children visited Morrisons in Diss and the Co-op in Framlingham to purchase their ingredients and to look at how the supermarkets promote healthy eating. Pupils were also invited to a 'Tasting Event' organised by the school Eats which will allow the children and their parents to sample some of the healthy foods that are offered as part of our school dinners menu. Headteacher Roisin Wiseman said "Schools have a responsibility to engage with current research about the rapidly increasing rates of child obesity and diet related diseases. If we raise pupil awareness of the need for a healthy diet and frequent exercise not only can we encourage our children to stay healthy now but they are more likely to become ambassadors for a healthy lifestyle in the future. By introducing our children to a wider range of physical activity such as handball this term and sailing next term we hope to show them that sport really is for all and that there's something for everyone in the world of exercise!"



NEWS FROM WILBY PARISH COUNCIL

Although there has not been a meeting of the Parish Council since 11 January progress has been made on a number of issues of interest to the community.

Defibrillator

The defibrillator has been installed in the former telephone box outside Wilby Primary School and is now activated and ready to use. A well attended Community Awareness Seminar was held in the village hall on 8 February at which the Community Heartbeat Trust explained the nature of a sudden cardiac arrest (which affects some 200 people a day in the UK), how to give appropriate immediate first aid with chest compressions and how to use the defibrillator in the very short time likely to be available to save the patient's life. The first step in any such emergency is to dial 999 for the Ambulance Service who will advise precisely what to do, whether the defibrillator should be used, and if so confirm the entry code. The defibrillator is in a bright yellow locked cabinet for which the entry code is C159X. Householders may wish to record this code in a prominent place. The defibrillator itself is designed to be used by non-medically trained people and provides both voice and video instructions which take you through what to do.

Speed Indicator Device

In response to comments in the Village Survey on speeding traffic the Council has now secured agreement to the use of a Speed Indicator Device. This will be displayed from time to time on the B1118 adjacent to Church Close and on the Horham/Worlingworth approach road to Wilby near Briarwood House, warning drivers of their actual speed having entered the 30 mph limit. The various devices available are being evaluated with a view to an order being placed following the Council meeting on 1 March. The costs are being met from provisions already made in the Council's accounts together with a grant from SCC Councillor Guy McGregor's Transport Local Budget.

DO YOU HAVE OIL-FIRED CENTRAL HEATING? DO YOU WANT TO SUPPORT THE COMMUNITY?

Rix Petroleum has been delivering central heating oil in Wilby and surrounding areas for many years under a 'syndicate' scheme, originated in Brundish and Laxfield. We are pleased to say that Wilby has now established a syndicate arrangement of its own based upon the existing customers. Under the scheme, in addition to offering frequently lower than usual prices, Rix will make an annual donation for the benefit of the community in Wilby, based upon the total amount of oil ordered. These advantages arise from the economies of scale whereby Rix tankers can discharge a full load in a relatively small area.

Anyone wishing to join the scheme can set up a central heating oil syndicate account by ringing Rix on 01953-457057, selecting the 'Domestic Sales' option and asking to join the Wilby syndicate. The main contact is Shiona Dennison but anyone in the Domestic Sales office should be able to help.

The Wilby syndicate is effective from the next round of Rix deliveries which will be during the week commencing 10 April 2017. Thereafter, the dates are w/c 10 July and w/c 9 October 2017. Dates for 2018 will be announced later. Rix ring all Wilby account holders about a week before the scheduled syndicate delivery date and ask if any oil is required and what quantity. They will quote the price per litre. Rix syndicate prices are likely to be lower than other suppliers but customers can of course check prices with other suppliers before confirming their order. The minimum order is 500 litres. Payment is required in advance, based upon the quantity ordered. Debit card payments incur no fee but credit card payments are plus 1.5%.

This notice is issued on behalf of the Parish Council to encourage participation in a scheme which generates funds for the community. The Parish Council does not endorse any specific heating oil supplier, the selection of any such supplier being a matter of individual choice.

Next Meeting

The next meeting of the Parish Council takes place in the Village Hall at 7.30 pm on **Wednesday 1 March 2017**. All are very welcome to attend.
