Dear Friends

A Child is born. But that's not where I want to start.

We were recently in the far north west of Scotland, in the hamlet of Arnisdale. We had just had a good walk through the woods along the side of the loch. The single track road finishes here. There is nothing else. "Ring for tea" said the sign in the Tea Hut. And Sheena came. Three generations have lived in her tiny stone cottage. Her tea and home-made scones were delicious. The rain lashed outside (and in through the two open doors), but we were secure in her company. Ten miles towards civilisation at Glenelg, the shop owner drives each morning for 20 miles for the papers. To our astonished looks, he responded simply, "people cannot do wi'out their paper".

A Child is born. He was born at the hub of the then world, where news would travel fastest. God's grace was extraordinary. He gave us not passing tea and scones, but the exemplary life to follow. A life force that is always present, whether we notice or not. A life that encountered as much tragedy as ours, but mostly more. A life that, again and again, showed us how to deal with all the

lashings of wind and rain our lives throw at us. As our world darkens into winter, let us look into our own darkness too, 'press the bell for tea' and prepare to

#### News from the Parish Council

The Parish Council held its regular monthly meeting on 7th November 2012, the main business being concerned with planning issues.

#### **New Planning Applications**

The Council supported, by a majority, a revised planning application for a change of use of the barn at Old Church Cottage including shared access from the main road. Council also supported a minor change to an agreed planning consent at Moat Farm.

#### Church Close Development

The Planning Officer with representatives from the Housing Department, Orwell Housing Association, their Architects and the District Councillor held an informal meeting with the Parish Council on 31st October 2012 to discuss the proposed Church Close development. The developer is willing to make a number of changes to the proposed scheme to take account of many of the comments made previously by the Parish Council. In particular these include improved access to the existing Church Close properties

and more car parking, retaining the option of pedestrian access to the churchyard and re-siting the proposed dwellings to increase the distance from existing boundaries resulting in a smaller area of common public space in the centre of the development. The detailed design of the houses remains work in progress. The proposal still includes ten houses as this was considered necessary by the developer given the very large District Council waiting list for affordable homes and the importance of making best use of the available sites. The proximity of Stradbroke was deemed to compensate for the lack of amenities and facilities in Wilby. Tenants for the houses would first be drawn from Wilby and surrounding villages consistent with the District Council's waiting list and housing allocation system.

The above was reported publicly at the Parish Council meeting. The Parish Council will now work with the other parties concerned aiming to achieve a revised proposal that will be appropriate for the site and the village. The points and concerns raised so far by parishioners will be made clear to the developer and it is hoped that many of these can be resolved. The Parish Council and residents will have the opportunity to comment on the new planning application in the normal way when it is submitted.

#### Police Report

The Police had recorded two cases of burglary in Wilby in the past month: a lawnmower stolen in Russell's Green and a ladder stolen in Worlingworth Road. The Police strongly recommended a number of common sense precautions to prevent theft and unauthorised access, such as keeping sheds and garages locked when not in use, keeping houses locked and keys out of sight, locking cars etc. etc.

#### Meetings Schedule

The Council agreed to move on to a schedule of meetings in alternative months (excluding August and December) in 2013 ie January, March, May, July, September and November. Special meetings would be called as necessary to deal with planning applications or other essential business which could not be dealt with at a routine meeting.

#### Next meeting

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be held in the Coronation Hall at 7.30pm on Wednesday 5th December 2012 at which the budget for 2013-14 will be considered. All are welcome to attend.

Brian Jaquest's exhibition of local people and their homes was a real success and was left in place on the outside walls of the hall until the beginning of Autumn. Passers-by stopped and people, who heard by word of mouth, came to look. It was a real magnet.

Penny Dupuy and Amanda Day organised a fascinating exhibition inside the hall. It was brilliant and depicted Wilby village in the past. There were only a few days when people could visit it because the hall was needed for other things.

A time capsule has been stored away for years to come. How will things have changed when it is opened! Thank you to everyone involved with that grand and happy event.

#### Cats and Kittens

I

I was both moved and shocked at the account of the abandoned kittens and strangled cat in last month's newsletter. It is so sad that such cases of animal cruelty exist. Only last year I witnessed animal cruelty of a different kind, the neglect of the owner to feed and care for their pet. It was only when I buried the poor soul did I realise that he'd been starved. I felt terrible for minding my own business and being polite when I could have done something to save him. There are so many animal charities who are not judgemental, who just want what is best for the animal, so there is no excuse to dump or neglect your pet. On the other hand, animal rights do not seem to apply to foxes. I keep chickens so I fear the visit by a fox more than most and have spent a fortune on fencing to keep them out. However, last spring I found a bitch who had been shot one rainy night. She had run off to find shelter where she died in the tumbledown building at the rear of our cottage. I suppose I was naive to think that when a fox is shot it is killed instantly. Her teats were swollen suggesting milk, so she had cubs too. I saw the pain in her face, frozen in death. As I buried her I thought no fellow creature deserves such an end. This was not a one off as only a few weeks later I saw another fox which had been shot and had curled up to die in a ditch. And their persecution is In the name of Tradition, to protect the landowners' game so that they can receive the same fate. Or is this just an excuse to be acceptably murderous to another creature which has just as much right to be here as us. Sherie Brinkley

#### Controlling the Cat Population Humanely

Animal rescue charities are reporting record high numbers of abandoned and unwanted cats as harsh economic conditions continue. Responsible pet ownership involves the prevention of unwanted litters by neutering all animals from an early age. A number of national charities offer help with the cost of neutering for pet owners on low incomes (proof of this may be required). For more information on these contact:

PDSA provides veterinary treatment for the sick and injured pets of people who are struggling to afford vet care. To be eligible for treatment, pet owners must be in receipt of either council tax benefit or housing benefit and live within postcode areas IP21, IP22 or IP23. Pets must be registered in advance of treatment; for more information or to find out how to register, call 0800 731 2502 or visit www.pdsa.org.uk

Stray and Feral Cats: If you become aware of a stray cat and/or kittens in your area it is best to act quickly. Just one unneutered female cat could produce up to 18 kittens a year, or 20,000 descendants over five years.

Initially, ask around if someone already owns the animal. Next, make a note of the location and the movements of the cat (cats are creatures of habit and will often keep to a routine, particularly with a good source of food). If possible try to count any kittens that you see with a mother cat. Then contact the Cats Protection National Helpline 03000 12 12 12 or Suffolk Animal Rescue 01728 860937 for advice on trapping. The organisation that traps the cats will need the permission of the landowner and it is always helpful if a local person takes responsibility to monitor the traps. Sue Dickinson
