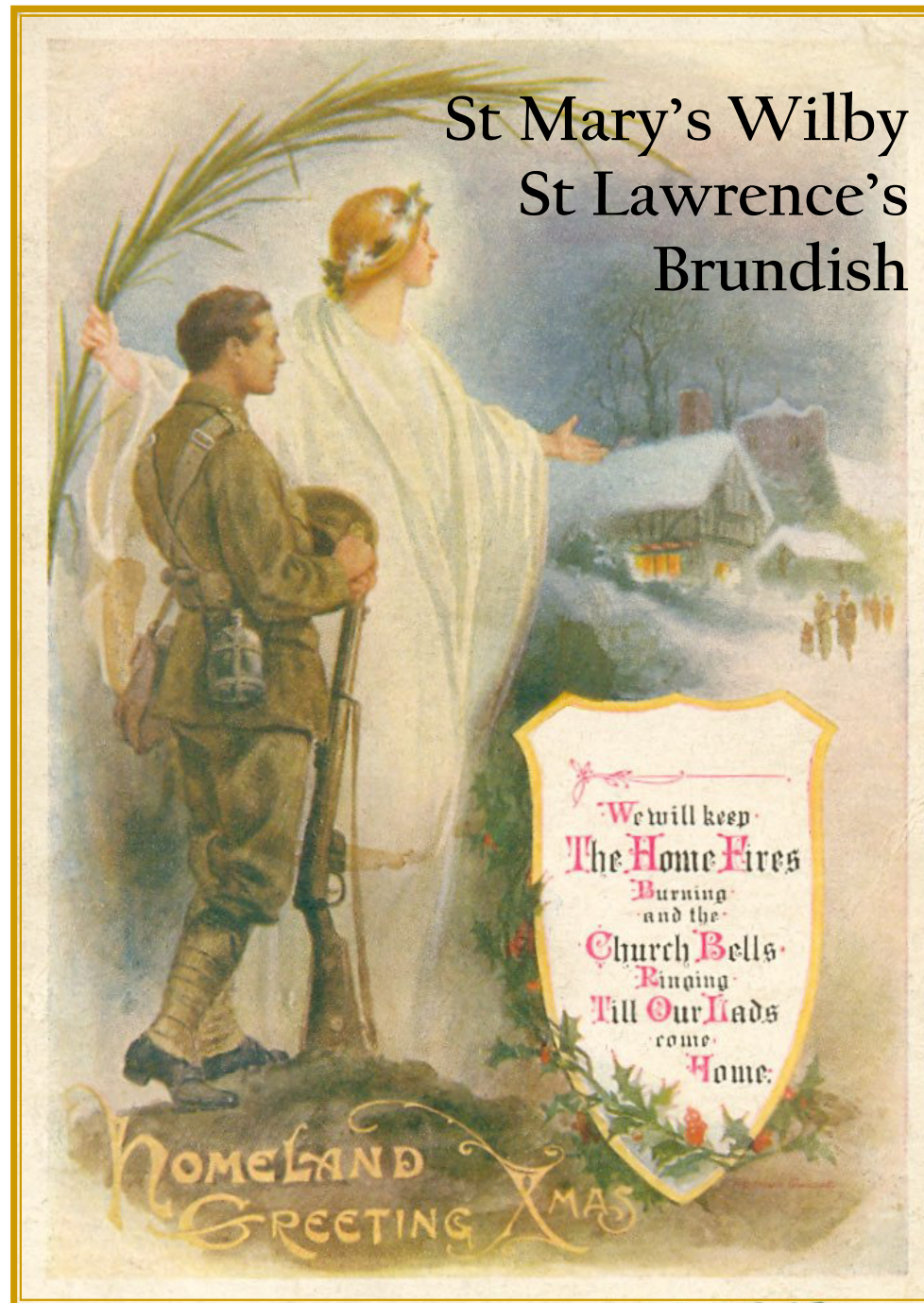

NEWS FROM WILBY PARISH COUNCIL - December 2014

The Parish Council met on 5 November 2014 and a warm welcome was extended to our new Clerk, Julie Collett. The Council made a number of decisions potentially relevant to the well being of Wilby residents.

Speed Restriction – London City Road

The Council wholeheartedly supported the request from residents to do something about speeding traffic on London City Road . Accordingly Council will make a strong case to the Highways authority at Suffolk County Council requesting that a speed restriction be placed on London City Road in particular to safeguard residents whose houses front the road, from The Shingles to the junction with Wilby Lane at Barley View.

Defibrillator

Council strongly supported a request that Wilby have access to a defibrillator. The matter is now being pursued with colleagues in Brundish to establish what funding is available, the number and deployment of devices required and the provision of First Responders.

Village Survey

Council agreed to undertake a Village Survey. This will seek to establish basic information about the village and its residents and importantly to find out what issues are important to residents and what changes they would wish, or indeed not wish, to see in future in terms of services, facilities, new housing etc. The information collected , which would be anonymous, would be used by the Parish Council to inform its decisions, particularly when considering planning applications, and by other village organisations, such as the Village Hall, in planning their activities. A team has been established under Councillor Ian Taylor, which will now examine in detail the design of the survey, how it will be undertaken, the analysis and publication of the results and likely costs etc. leading to a firm proposal for consideration and approval by the Parish Council.

Planning Applications

Council considered a number of current planning applications, supporting Listed Building Consent for conversion of a barn to residential accommodation at Green Farm (planning approval having already been granted). It did not support however a proposal for change of use of Sundial Lodge to enable the operation of a Forest School facility. Council was particularly concerned at the traffic and safety considerations in London City Road arising from parties of schoolchildren attending courses at the proposed Forest School , the failure of the application to recognise the proximity of neighbouring property which would be materially affected by the proposal and factual errors in the proposal itself.

Public Forum

A space has been made available on the village website for parishioners to place comments and raise issues of likely public interest.

Next Meeting

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be held in the Coronation Hall at **7.30 pm on Wednesday, 7th January 2015**. All are welcome to attend. If parishioners have concerns or items they would like discussed please contact any Councillor or the Clerk (Mrs Julie Collett on 01986 798258 or by e-mail to j.collett5@btinternet.com). The draft agenda will be placed on the Parish noticeboard (and on the website) two weeks before the meeting with the final agenda being displayed three clear days before the meeting.

Service of Remembrance and Dedication of our New War Memorial

9.30am Sunday, 9th November on Brundish Village Green

In pouring rain, at least 28 people from Brundish came to pay their respects to the war dead of both World War I and World War II and to celebrate the inauguration of this memorial to the men of Brundish who gave their lives. It completes the Village Green sign which now looks magnificent and it is a fine tribute to the brave men of Brundish.

The Revd David Burrell conducted the service and two stirring hymns were sung. John Graham read out the names of each of the soldiers. Tony St Quinton laid a poppy wreath followed by the two minute silence.

Fortunately Gerald Western had provided a small gazebo which protected a few people but the rest of the congregation stood under umbrellas. It was a moving service and one befitting the occasion of the hundred year anniversary of the First World War.

Men of Brundish

And so we stood. This, the generation of Brundish of now.

In their shadows as they must have stood, preparing for war.

Optimistic, eager, keen for the fight.

Their names tolled. One by one by one. Quietly, slowly, respectfully.

Twenty Men of Brundish. Now cut into granite. Reunited.

Forever recalled.

Under the oak tree we stood. In awe, grateful. Silently remembering them.
