Dear Friends,

February always reminds me of a recording made by Ian Dury many years ago – reasons to be cheerful! Longer days, daffodils, crocuses, Saint Valentine's Day and so on.

Sadly, February also sees the end of the extended Christmas season on the 2nd with the festival that has come to be known as Candlemas. Like so many Christian celebrations, this date was taken from a pagan festival which celebrated the mid-point between the shortest day of the year (21st December) and the spring equinox (21st March). It became fixed on the 2nd February as it is exactly forty days after we celebrate the birth of Christ; it was then the custom to take a forty-day old baby boy to the temple in Jerusalem to be presented to God by thankful parents.

In pre-Christian times it was known as the 'feast of lights', when this mid-point was celebrated by lighting many candles. Also known as the 'Presentation of Christ in the Temple' and the 'Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary', our services traditionally use St Luke's Gospel 2.22-40, which contains a very famous section – the 'Song of Simeon' or 'Nunc Dimittis', now an integral part of evening prayer. This records the words of Simeon on seeing the baby Jesus in the temple: 'Lord now lettest thou thy servant depart in peace, for my eyes have seen thy salvation, which thou hast prepared before the face of all people.' As a precursor to Easter, Simeon also foretells Jesus' destiny, the fulfilment of his ministry – our salvation. Another reason to be cheerful.

NEWS FROM WILBY SCHOOL

Welcome to the first of what will now be a regular feature in the Parish newsletter – news and happenings from Wilby School.

The Spring term at Wilby School is now well underway. The school is busy and thriving and has much to celebrate including the welcoming of several new children at the start of this term.

Towards the end of the Autumn term the 'league tables' were released for the performance of primary schools across the country, according to how well children do in their Key Stage 2 (Year 6) SATs. According to this, Wilby is the best performing primary school in Suffolk, and the joint 81st in England – out of 16,000. We recently received a letter from the Secretary of State for Education confirming that we were one of just 159 schools where all children achieved a level 4 or above in reading, writing and maths. Congratulations to the children for their hard work (and to the parents and staff for theirs!).

We are proud of our Nursery at Wilby School, where all the lead staff are qualified teachers. If you have a child who will be three years old by 31 March and would him or her considered for the Summer term, please let us know.

Music continues to be an important part of life at Wilby School. On 4th March children in years three to six will take part in the 'Celebration of Schools Music' at the Snape Maltings concert hall. This involves working with a professional sound and lighting crew and attending a workshop led by a famous composer or musician, and culminating in a performance in front of a capacity crowd of 800! The performance will be repeated in Wilby – watch for announcements! In December our three Year 6 cellists took part in a special day at Benjamin Britten's home 'The Red House' in Aldeburgh with eminent cellist Matthew Barley.

Just before Christmas (indeed, on the same day as the school's Christmas lunch!) the school's football team came joint third place out of 16 teams in an interschool football competition at Stradbroke High School.

During the Autumn term children, staff and parents raised £695 for the Aspire spinal injury charity by a mega swimathon – equivalent to four English Channel crossings!

The annual Christmas Fayre, organised by the Friends of Wilby School Association, raised £786 for the school. The event was great fun and this year included several local businesses with festive products – thanks to all.

NEWS FROM WILBY PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council held its first meeting of the year on 8 January 2014 where the principal business was to set the Council's budget for 2014.

Budget 2014/15

Council resolved that the precept (the proportion of the budget to be met from the Council Tax) should be held at £3,500 (compared to £3,497 in 2013/14).

Vacancy

There is a vacancy on the Parish Council following the resignation of Marian Ward. Anyone interested in being co-opted on to the Council is invited to attend the next meeting of the Council on 5 March 2014. In the meantime they should please advise the Parish Clerk (Alex Pullen on 01379, 670609 or the Chairman (Ian Williamson on 01379 388034) of their interest.

Church Close housing development

Anyone who is interested in applying for one of the affordable homes to be built at Church Close should please contact Karen Suddes, Home Ownership Officer, Orwell Housing Association on 01473 228604 or email: karens@orwell-housing.co.uk.

Arising from the proposed development, £7,800 will be made available for sport and recreation facilities including children's play allocated on a Parish, Ward, Sub District and District basis. £2,300 is available for Children's play and informal recreation facilities in Wilby Parish should a site be available. £1,600 is available within District Councillor Gemmill's ward for village halls and for outdoor sports. Anybody seeking to access these funds should approach Mid Suffolk District Council

(Mrs Robyn Rake - Infrastructure and Project Co-ordination Officer - Development Management on 01449 724539) in the first instance.

Crime

The Police have reported no crime in Wilby since their last report on 6 November 2013. However the Police have warned householders to beware of burglars acting as bogus callers claiming to be on official business. Householders are advised to check before opening the door, seek proof of identity, not to leave the caller in the house alone and in cases of any doubt refuse entry. If worried householders should dial 999 immediately and ask for the police.

A landowner has recently reported trespassing on his land. Walkers are reminded

that they should keep to designated footpaths to remain within the law unless they have the owner's permission to walk elsewhere.

A case has recently occurred of random shooting at young trees in the Wilby Lane, Foals Green area. The police were informed and are treating the matter as anti-social behaviour. Any further occurrence of this dangerous practice should be notified to the police immediately (dial 101 and ask for Suffolk Police) quoting report number P.1311120169.

Neighbourhood Planning

Council has agreed to explore with Stradbroke Parish Council a joint approach to Neighbourhood Planning. This would be advantageous given Wilby's proximity to and links with Stradbroke as well as enabling the sharing of the substantial costs involved.

The Parish Noticeboard has been damaged in the recent bad weather. Steps are in hand to have it repaired.
