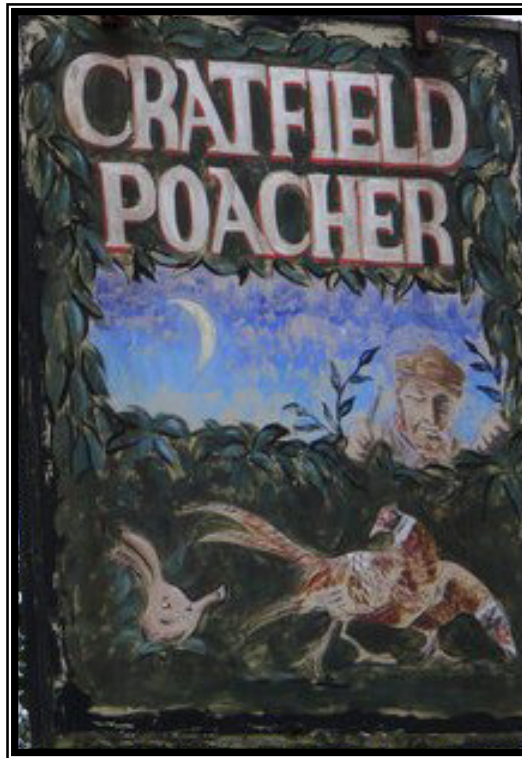

Dear Friends,

As I sit down to write this letter, news has just come in that nine people have been murdered at a prayer meeting in a church in Charleston, South Carolina. Such an act of wanton barbarism must surely shake us to the very core of all those things that we hold dear, but it leaves the question: what is our response? What Would Jesus Do? By the time you read this, the reaction of the community will probably be known, but I fear it may lead to even more violence and bloodshed; I pray that it doesn't. Sadly, hate very often breeds even more hate. But this is where the Christian is different.

In the sermon on the mount (Matthew, chapter 5 et seq.), Jesus shows himself as one who puts things right, turns things round and promotes above all, peace, reconciliation and love. Hopefully, such events as that in Charleston will pass most of us by, but we are still sometimes faced with conflict in our lives that leads us to be angry with someone and perhaps consider retaliation of some sort, to 'get our own back'. Well verse 22 of chapter 5 makes Jesus' response to that very clear.

My great hero of ministry – Saint Francis of Assisi – wrote a prayer which is often used as a rule of life, and I feel is particularly applicable at this time. It also led to the words of a well-known hymn:

*Lord, make me an instrument of thy peace.
Where there is hatred, let me sow love;
Where there is injury, pardon;
Where there is doubt, faith;
Where there is despair, hope;
Where there is darkness, light;
Where there is sadness, joy.*

*O divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek
To be consoled as to console,
To be understood as to understand,
To be loved as to love;
For it is in giving that we receive;
It is in pardoning that we are pardoned;
It is in dying to self that we are born to eternal life.*

Village Survey

We will shortly be issuing the Village Survey. This has been compiled in consultation with St Mary's Church, the School and the Village Hall. The survey asks a number of questions on various different topics so that residents can tell us what is important to them in the village and what changes (if any) they would like to see in terms of housing, facilities, services etc. Collectively the answers will help the Parish Council and other organisations in the village make their decisions and plan their activities so that these reflect the needs and priorities identified by residents in the survey.

Sufficient copies of the survey forms will be hand delivered to each house in the village so that each member of the household (aged 16 and above) has the opportunity to fill in the form and let us know their views. The intention is to collect the survey forms from each household some two to three weeks after they have been issued.

The future of our village is important to us all. There has not been a community wide consultation like this for some time so we hope that everyone will take the opportunity to take part in this survey. The replies will be anonymous and the results when available will be published and a public meeting convened, probably in the autumn, to discuss the findings and follow up action.

Resignations and appointments 2014/2015

Our Parish Clerk, Chris Smart who took on the roll as a volunteer without pay, has resigned. It became obvious during her tenure that the role of Clerk required an ever increasing amount of her time, which she needs to spend on her business commitments. Celia Drakard decided not to seek re-election to the parish council. She was a long serving member of the council, a past chairwoman as well as a trustee of the village hall and has worked tirelessly for the village over this period. On behalf of the Parish council I would like to express our thanks and appreciation.

Diane Palmer has been elected as a new parish councillor and will continue to look after the interests of the village green which she and her volunteers have been doing for a number of years now.

Summary of the last year

The village war memorial was finished in time for 11th November 2014, Armistice Sunday and we held a well attended but rather wet service on the village green.

In July we held the first *Village Fete on the Green* which was very well attended by a good cross-section of the village and wider local community. We raised some £500. We intend to hold another village fete on 19th July this year to raise much needed funds for the village green.

The Crown pub together with Chris Smart have run a number of very successful events to raise money for the village green. Chris and The Crown's continued support of the village green is very much appreciated.

Regrettably this year we have had to put the precept up by nearly a third to enable us to employ a professional clerk. Over the last few years, changes in regulations and additional requirements for financial transparency have made it increasingly obvious that the job of parish clerk is too much work for a volunteer who is in full time employment. Our new parish clerk is Dina Bedwell who is also the full time clerk of the much larger Shotley and Debenham parish councils. As a professional clerk she has the time to familiarise herself and be fully up to date with everything we are legally required to do.
