Dear Friends,

One of the less attractive traits of human beings is the way we load expectations on to people that are unrealistic and unfair. Then, when the expectations are not met, we criticise the others and not ourselves.

Jesus was well aware of what people wanted him to be and do. He knew he could not be the conquering liberator of their imagination because his path was to lead to defeat and death – something very hard for his followers to accept.

St Luke tells us that even when Jesus hung on the cross the leaders scoffed at him, saying:

"He saved others; let him save himself if he is the Messiah of God, his chosen one!" The soldiers also mocked him, coming up and offering him sour wine, and saying, "If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself!" (Luke 23:35-37.)

These must have been bitter words for the Son of God to hear, when he knew that he could have summoned legions of angels to release him from the cross, but chose not to.

In that choice he in fact exceeded all expectation. Instead of liberating the nation he sacrificed himself so that every man, woman and child in the world could come back to God. That's how much he loved us.

No-one on that first Good Friday believed that Jesus would rise again, although he had told them he would. On Easter Day he turned defeat into victory and silenced the mockery of his enemies by a far greater miracle than stepping down from the cross would have been. However, he still didn't do what we might have expected, namely to appear to the Jewish leaders and Roman soldiers.

Instead he appeared secretly to his friends, that not very wonderful bunch of disciples. Gradually the message that he was alive again spread and spread, so that now all round the world people can rejoice in God's great work in saving lost humanity. He has done far more than we could ask, or think, or deserve. It's a secret that we can all share in one of our churches over this Easter season and beyond 'Christ has died; Christ is risen; Christ will come again!'



WILBY PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council met on Wednesday 2 March 2016 at which the major items of business were the Village Survey, the defibrillator, a planning application and arrangements for the Annual Parish Meeting on 4 May 2016.

Village Survey

The public meeting on 24 February 2016 was very well attended with 30 residents present. A record of the meeting has been placed on the Council noticeboard and website and has been emailed to those on the register. A summary of the responses to the survey has been similarly distributed and has been included as an insert with the April Parish newsletter.

Of the two main issues raised in the survey and discussed at the meeting the following can be reported. Further reports on these and other topics will be provided from time to time.

Broadband

FramBroadband, a wireless broadband provider, attended the Council meeting and confirmed their intention to extend coverage to Wilby. This would be achieved by erecting a 40m mast at Stanway Green and installing a repeater aerial on Wilby Church tower broadband speeds of up to 10Mbps would be available. Subject to obtaining the necessary permissions from MSDC and the Church it was hoped to have the installation in place by the autumn of 2016. Details of the FramBroadband offer, costs etc. are available at www.frambroadband.com.

In the meantime, for broadband provided via our telephone lines, it may be possible to improve on current speeds. Advice from Robin Cross, a Wilby resident and former communications research engineer, is published separately in the newsletter. *See page 12*.

Traffic Calming

Steps are in hand to meet with Highways department officials to establish what traffic calming measures would be permissible in Wilby, the process to get them installed and the likely costs involved. In the interim costs have been obtained for the provision of a solar or battery powered automatic speed indicator. Budget provision of £1700 has been made towards co-funding such measures. District Councillor Julie Flatman has provided a grant of £400 from her Locality Budget to add to the resources at the Council's disposal.

Defibrillator

£1775 has been donated using resources built up from the Rix Petroleum Community Fund and a contract has been let with the Community Heartbeat Trust to cover the costs of the purchase and installation of the defibrillator in the former public telephone box.

Planning Application

A planning application for the erection of a two storey extension with a single storey link , for the repair and re-erection of a c17th century barn as games room, store and two bay carport with all associated works at Town Farm, Stradbroke Road, Brundish (in the parish of Wilby) was supported without qualification.

Brome Household Waste Site

Tenders have been invited by MSDC for the operation of the Brome Household Waste Site with a view to it re-opening in April but probably with a more restricted service.

Police Report

Following reorganisation the Police will no longer regularly attend meetings of the Parish Council. Crime statistics for Wilby are however accessible on a new Police website, www.suffolk.police.uk

Annual Parish Meeting

The Annual Parish Meeting will be held in the Coronation Hall at 7 pm on Wednesday 4 May 2016. It will follow the format of previous years with reports from village organisations on their activities and plans. Cheese and wine will be available at the conclusion of the meeting. Everyone is invited to attend this meeting to hear what is going on and to voice any matters of concern.

Next Meeting Wilby Parish Council

The Council will hold its next meeting, which is its annual meeting, in the Coronation Hall at 7.30 pm on Wednesday 18 May 2016. As always members of the public are welcome to attend. St Lawrence Restoration Project UPDATE

Work has continued on the re-pointing of the north wall, and will continue for another two weeks to completion.

Attention will then turn to the porch repairs.

There are four downpipes still to be put in place once the re-pointing is completed and the scaffolding removed.

Currently, the scheduled work is due to be completed mid May as we have been held up somewhat by the recent cold wet weather.

We are giving consideration to re-turfing the entrance to the church yard, as opposed to the planned seeding in order that the appearance will be improved in readiness for two weddings due in June and July

Perhaps the most important comment to be made is that it appears that the new rainwater goods and draining are already having a positive impact if you look at the current dryness of the church aisle.

Having problems with your broadband speed? These ideas might help.

I'm a retired Communications Research Engineer and would like to add my observations to the Wilby/Broadband debate.

I was struck by the range of broadband speeds reported at the Wilby parish questionnaire results meeting on the 24th February. Considering we are all broadly the same distance from the Stradbroke exchange, I would have expected a narrower range of speeds, so why the range? In my own case, I have found in the past that old internal phone wiring can reduce broadband speed. Back in the day when telephones were fitted with real bells, extensions were wired so that the transmission circuits were in parallel and the bells were in series because they needed a lot of current. Each new extension would lead to more and more wiring.

These days the ringer is low current and can be integrated with the transmission circuit. This means that phones can be simply connected in parallel with two conductors. Additionally, cordless phones are easily available and do away with wiring.

Fitting a BT iplate onto your master socket will disconnect the extension bell wire for you and leave you with only the connections you need for a modern telephone and ADSL router setup. The bell wire can act as an aerial and introduce unwanted noise into the signal.

Each telephone requires an ADSL filter so that the phone doesn't interfere with the broadband router signals. Some filters do their job better than others and it worthwhile getting the best ones you can find.

Finally, it's worth knowing that each ADSL enabled line has what's called an IP profile. This is a throttle or restriction on the rate at which data can be sent down the line and is part of the exchange management system as there is no point in sending data at a rate faster than can be utilised. Imagine that if Andy Murray could return a maximum of one ball a second, if you send him two balls a second, he is still limited by his maximum!

The upshot is that if you can improve your broadband speed by simplifying your wiring etc, the IP profile won't track your improvements for a couple of days. To see the IP profile for your line, if you are with BT, go to http://www.speedtest.btwholesale.com/ and complete the test including the further diagnostics. High speed broadband for Wilby is at the survey stage so at least BT knows where we are! Good luck, all! Robin Cross, The Old Forge, Wilby: robin.cross@suffolkonline.net




