Dear Friends

In this benefice we are served by 10 Churchwardens, there are six churchwarden posts unoccupied. The post of churchwarden has been legally recognised in England since the twelfth century and it is normal for there to be two wardens per parish, it is one of the longest standing official posts in this country. The work of the churchwarden has increased over the ages especially when it became the responsibility of the congregation to pay for the upkeep and improvement of the church building. Churchwardens take on the leading role for the whole community in church matters; because it is the whole community of the parish and not just the congregation that appoints them. Each year there is a short meeting held before the AGM when the wardens are elected. Every parish member is eligible to vote at this meeting because within their role churchwardens not only represent the bishop to the parish but also the parish to the bishop.

To be a churchwarden you must be baptised, you must be on the church's electoral roll and a regular communicant. Soon after they are elected the Archdeacon who represents the Bishop admits the wardens to their office. Each year the Bishop will send enquiries to the churchwardens so that he can be kept abreast of any concerns felt in the parishes along with any joys that are being experienced. According to church-law a churchwarden's main tasks are the upkeep of the church building and its contents so that it is in a fit state for worship and depending upon their own skills and abilities they may lead worship and undertake pastoral work. During an interregnum, (the time between a priest leaving and another coming) Churchwardens share the responsibility for the running of the church and its worship in partnership with the rural dean.

In these days when multi-parish benefices are becoming the norm churchwardens take on an ever increasing roll and we should be grateful to those who give of their time so freely and conscientiously; because we/I, would be sunk without them. There are currently two parishes without churchwardens and there are two parishes that only have one in post. If you feel you have something to offer and would want to become part of that long line of men and women who over the years have looked after the churches in this benefice then why not offer your services. The parishes currently without wardens are Tannington and Bedfield, the parishes with only one warden are Cratfield and Monk Soham.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all my churchwardens for their constant support and I hope that you will all want to carry on with your good offices for the next year.

NEWS FROM WILBY PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council held its first meeting of the year on 6 January 2016 at which the main items of business were:

Budget 2016/17

The Council agreed its budget for 2016/17 which includes provision for: costs associated with defibrillator; funding to contribute to the costs of follow up action by the Council arising from the Village Survey; an increase in the donations made to local charities; and an increase in employment costs to allow for an annual increment to the Clerk's salary. It has been possible to accommodate this additional expenditure without any increase to the precept – the sum met from Council Tax – which will remain at £3,500. Copies of the budget will be posted on the Parish noticeboard and on the web-site when the precept has been approved by Mid Suffolk District Council.

Defibrillator

Funding having been secured from the Rix Petroleum Community Fund, a contract is being let to the Community Heartbeat Trust for the provision of the defibrillator and ancillary services. Recent damage to the telephone box, (where the defibrillator is to be housed securely), has been reported to BT for repair before the Council purchases it for a nominal sum.

Village Survey

Arrangements have been made for a public meeting to be held at 7.00 pm on Wednesday 24 February 2016 in the Coronation Hall at which the results of the Village Survey will be presented. Representatives from the Parish Council, Wilby School, St Mary's Church and the Village Hall will be present to answer questions from residents and to explain how the survey results will be put to good use. Everyone is invited to attend what should be an informative and hopefully lively and constructive meeting on the future of the village. The Village Hall bar will be open from 6.30 pm and after the meeting. Tea and coffee will also be available.

Speed Limit – London City Road

Council was informed that Suffolk County Council's Speed Panel has rejected the proposed introduction of a speed limit on part of London City Road on technical grounds. Further information is awaited on the precise reasons for the rejection.

Communications

Councillor Guy McGregor has informed Council that the proposed Phase 2 rollout of superfast broadband is being delayed pending resolution of a claim for refund of state aid contributions made to BT. This will affect Wilby which expected to receive the enhanced service in 2017. Guy McGregor also advised that the provision of a new shared mobile phone mast in Worlingworth would not now proceed due to sight line problems.

Next meeting

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be held at 7.30 pm on Wednesday 2 March 2016 in the Coronation Hall. *All are welcome to attend.*

NEWS FROM WILBY SCHOOL

All at the School would like to take this opportunity to wish everyone a very happy and healthy 2016. The holidays seem an age ago and school business is well and truly underway with only the occasional challenge from either the weather or the roadworks! Thank-you to everyone for their co-operation over the roadworks just by the School; the siting of them has significantly increased the risk to children crossing the road and the School is very aware of the increased congestion and delays at school run times to all road users. Please be assured that the school is doing its best to minimise disruption to everyone whilst ensuring the safety of the children.

The weather has also done its best to thwart plans for the installation of new outdoor play equipment at school! The Friends of Wilby School Association (*FoWSA*) have again been very successful in fundraising and have funded a series of outdoor activity equipment - a trim trail, which will be installed on the school field. The equipment includes items such as rope bridges, climbing frames and balance activities for the children to play on during their break-times. The installation started on 18th January and weather permitting should be completed in 3 – 4 days. Huge thanks to the *FoWSA* team and all the parents who supported the events, the trim trail will be a fantastic addition to the school and help to support the children's physical co-ordination and development – whilst, most importantly, also being a lot of fun!

There are many other activities happening this term including Beech Class (year 5 and 6 children) performing at Snape Maltings Festival Hall as part of the Annual Celebration of Schools Music in March and run by Suffolk County Music Service. In the School's sharing assemblies each class will showcase their work to parents. Topics the classes are looking at this term range from natural disasters to space journeys and many things in between! The school also has a visiting author, Paeony Lewis, coming to spend time with the children as part of the world book day celebrations in March.

The "Tea and Toys" group for children between 0-5 years old continues on a Thursday morning, running between 9.30 am and 11.am. No need to book, just turn up –the team would love to see you. This group runs every Thursday that school is open. It will not run during half term week –Thursday 18th February, and the last one before school finishes for the Easter holidays is on Thursday 24th March.

Lent and Easter Services

Hence it is only now that we can formally thank all those wonderful souls who turned up at the church a couple of days before Christmas to give it the most thorough cleaning it needed pursuant to the understandable mess it had been in during the first part of the restoration programme. We are so lucky to have the kind of people in the village who give up their time, which is no less valuable to anyone else's, to do this sort of thing for our much loved church. Thank you so much, one and all.

Brundish Parish Ale.

I have had little response from my plea in last month's Newsletter regarding the Ale, so I think we will press on with a programme of events which I hope will be to the liking of everyone. I plan to have a chat with a few people who I hope can work together to make things happen over the first weekend of June. This will include, possibly, a quiz night, a soap box derby event, bale racing, a barbecue, and on the Sunday afternoon a Service of Thanksgiving for the, hopeful, completion of the church restoration, which will include The Chantry Singers and, perhaps, a special guest. That one is in the ether at the moment.

The word "ale", originally a West Saxon term, signified a festal event, and presumably later became to mean the actual beverage which was brewed to make money for the church. Research has unearthed that Brundish, at one time, had three ales per year, at Whitsun (Pentecost), Lammas/Harvest, and at Christmas. We are looking into the possibility of having a one-off "*St Lawrence's Ale*" brewed for the occasion.

It is so much a must that a good proportion of the village's population supports this event. It's not just about fund-raising for the church, but more importantly, to fulfil a need for us all to get together now and again and enjoy each other's company. As I have given you plenty of notice, I am hoping you might not book anything else over that weekend!

ST LAWRENCE'S CHURCH, BRUNDISH - RESTORATION

As we now move into the final stage of the current Heritage Lottery Restoration Project on our much loved church, I thought it might be a good time to let everyone know how things have progressed.

You will all have seen that the scaffolding is now, for the most part, removed as the Stone Masons have completed the work on the tower. The craftsmanship of these professionals has been quite remarkable. The original stone on the tower, had been bought over to this quiet corner of Suffolk by the Normans, almost a thousand years ago, from Caen in Northern France. Having identified this stone, the Stone Masons, G F Atthowe, have sourced the new stone from a quarry in Caen, thus ensuring that the new stone maintains the towers historical integrity. With the new oak replacement louvres now in situ the bell tower has been restored to its former glory. The south window by the organ has a new central stone support to replace the previous wooden support which had only be intended as a temporary fixture at some point in the distant past. Those of you visiting the church, I am sure will have appreciated the difference this had made to the window.

The vast majority of the drainage is now in place, and work has commenced on the next phase with the construction of efficient catch pits, which will take the water away from the church foundations. With cleaned guttering and new lead down pipes to be installed this should see a vast improvement in the dampness within the church, so noticeable particularly on the brickwork of the aisle.

The new church website is up and running, www.stlawrencebrundish.co.uk and work is progressing on a Heritage Trail which will allow visitors to explore both the church, and the churchyard with literature and boards on hand to point out areas of particular historical interest. A new plan of the churchyard has already been drawn, and it is hoped that from this document we will be able to undertake further work on graves of particular historical interest, as well as helping those researching family history. Links will also be forged with schools and special interest groups to ensure that the church continues to engage with the wider community.

I hope that the work will be completed by the end of March, when the contractors will also undertake landscaping to restore the condition of the churchyard.

I would also like to remind everyone who shops online about the Easy Fund Raising website or app. The total raised so far for the church restoration now stands at over £175. It costs nothing and is an extremely effective way of raising funds from companies that support this charitable initiative, donating 1-5% of the sale total to the nominated project of your choice. You merely have to register at Easy Funding for St Lawrence Church Restoration Fund and then click on every time you shop to Easy Fund Raising and search for the retailer of your choice. All the major retailers support it, John Lewis, Marks and Spencer, Waitrose, Sainsbury, Tesco et al. There is also a search option should you be using a smaller retailer, you will I hope be encouraged by the sheer volume of retailers who are prepared to donate, and every penny counts! All contributions are automatic, and however small, certainly do add up. This can also continue after this latest restoration project is completed, to help continue to fund raise towards future initiatives.
