

Dear Friends,

I have always regarded November as a month with two directions – looking back and then looking forward.

We start the month with Remembrance Sunday, and despite what some may say, this is not anachronistic, it is as relevant and important as it ever was, if not more so. We still have a debt of gratitude to those who have paid a price for defending our freedom, and to those who are today, prepared to do the same. Wearing a poppy is a public declaration of the support you give those who are injured and their families in recent and current conflicts, along with the families who have lost a loved one. Jesus, very often in his parables, highlighted the plight of widows and orphans and modern state support only goes so far, which gives us a wonderful opportunity to show our care and gratitude with their financial support and there are many organisations through which we can do this, one of the most prolific being the Royal British Legion.

On Sunday the 27th, Advent Sunday, we look to the future, not just Christmas but to our own eternal future when we will meet with Christ, however and whenever that happens, but meet him we will. Just as we would prepare for any meeting, we use the time of Advent for reflection and preparation of ourselves for that all important meeting with Christ. Advent Sunday - the 27th November, is also the start of a new year in the Church.

So November can be seen as where the past and the future meet, where we consider the past and what it means for the future, because as George Santayana said: "Those who fail to learn from history are doomed to repeat it."

This also serves to remind us of the timelessness of God, present in creation and our past, present with us now, and all we can rely on for the future.



Mrs Wiseman is thrilled to have the opportunity of leading the pupils, parents and dedicated teaching team at Wilby into the future.

Open Morning

Our school open morning on October 18th was well attended and visitors were able to join pupils in observing and taking part in a variety of activities including sport, drama, maths, science and literacy all based on the theme of chocolate.

Our next Open Morning is on December 7th 9.30-11.30am. All welcome. This time the theme is Christmas! There will be a variety of activities to watch and get involved in, including the chance to visit a free Santa's Grotto for our younger visitors. We welcome children and parents/ carers to come and get involved for the morning.

Sporting Success

We were very proud to hear that the school had been awarded the Silver School Games Mark. One of the criteria for successfully gaining the award is to ensure that children receive a broad sporting experience. As part of this continued provision Year 5 and 6 children had a fantastic day in Brandon Country Park doing orienteering. The school has also booked sailing and kayaking tuition for our Year 2,3 and 4 pupils in the summer term. Many of our children took part in the Inter-school Cross Country Trials at Mellis Common. Everyone who took part gave of their best and we were delighted to note that 5 of our runners came in the top ten of their races:

Charity work

On Saturday 8th of October Wilby pupils from Year 2 upwards, took part in a professional recording session in Ipswich as part of the Everlasting Light project. The children have learnt a variety of songs which have been recorded on a CD and DVD (on sale from 26th November) and will also take part in a concert in December at the Spa Pavillion in Felixstowe. All proceeds form CD/DVD and ticket sale will be collected in aid of the Tearfund Charity. Our Macmillan 'coffee afternoon' in October was well attended and raised a wonderful £120 for cancer research.

Following on from our very successful days out to The Museum of East Anglian Life and the Gressenhall Workhouse and Museum, all pupils in the school took part in a fabulous Victorian school day at Wilby on Thursday 6th October. The children loved the opportunity to bring history alive and took part in a wide variety of Victorian activities including: Drill, Assembly, Copy-Writing, Nature study, Maths learnt by rote, Poetry recitation and also taking part in a range of Victorian playground games. 


