Dear Friends,

One of my favourite hymns is Dear Lord and Father of mankind. Strangely, it was written by a man who deplored singing in church. John Greenleaf Whittier (1807-92) was a Quaker who firmly believed that God was best worshipped in silent meditation. However, he allowed the verses to be used in a hymn book in 1884, to which none other than Hubert Parry's music was later set.

The verse which I think encapsulates Whittier's sentiment is the fifth one:

Drop Thy still dews of quietness,
Till all our strivings cease;
Take from our souls the strain and stress,
And let our ordered lives confess
The beauty of thy peace.

This verse is most appropriate for modern living, where our lives are governed and dictated by the ever-moving, never sleeping world in which we live, even though it was written in the mid nineteenth century.

This always seems to come to the fore in the summer when holidays, gardens and the outdoor life place additional demands on us. As much as we should try to enjoy all that the better weather and holidays offer, think about trying to ensure that there is a regular moment where you are free from others, entertainment and demands, so that you can be still and at peace with God. This also can be a time for you to reflect on who you are and for a while at least stop being what others want you to be. This may lead to you experiencing what the last line of verse 5 is about – the beauty of God's peace.

Jesus often took himself off from the disciples and his followers to be with God and many of those in ministry try to go on a quiet retreat as often as they can for the same reason.

Have a happy, peaceful, restful and joyful Summer.



School trips



NEWS FROM BRUNDISH PARISH COUNCIL

Brundish Parish Council Chairman's Report

The second phase of the Village Green restoration has now been completed. We received a grant of £380 from councillor Matthew Hicks. The remainder of the cost was from money raised at the village Fete and the Brundish Crown. This year we hope to make a start on the third and final phase namely the fence around the village pond. Hopefully we will not need to do any more major restoration work for the foreseeable future.

This year The Village Fete will be held on Sunday 16th July.

The Brundish Crown quiz nights have raised over £200 this financial year their fund raising is very much appreciated.

The Defibrillator project is now the sole responsibility of the parish council and is fully funded. As well as £443.03 from the oil syndicate run by Rix, we also received £1,475, this is our share of the now former First Responders' money. We will now be in a position to replace the equipment if and when required.

For many years Tim Gillingham has very kindly assumed responsibility for cutting the grass on the village green. He is now unable to continue due to other commitments. Over this period he has saved the community a considerable amount of money that we would have spent employing a contractor to cut the grass.

This saving has enabled us to complete the much needed restoration of the boundary fences and gate posts.

A number of volunteers have agreed to cut the grass but we will need more help. If you are willing to cut the grass once a year please let me know.

Chris Smart has kindly taken on the role as Foot Path Warden for Brundish and is liaising with the Suffolk County council's Area Rights Of Way Officer. If you have any concerns about the footpaths in Brundish, please email *highbankaccoc@aol.com*.

Brundish Training Centre

Regular classes in the Training Centre continue, although Computer Club numbers have reduced, mainly because of advancing years. We offer a mix of Windows, Apple iPad and iPhone classes and workshops.

We are grateful for everything which Peter Palmer continues to do to support us, including his work to switch all the desktop and laptop computers over to Windows 10 and keeping Computer Club member's own computers running.

We are on three websites offering the Training Room as well as the Hall for hire and we have received a number of enquiries during the last year. The three websites are:

We will shortly have a Mac laptop to offer Apple OSX operating system and software training. This will include comparing and contrasting our existing Word for Windows with Word for Mac.

The relationship between the Training Centre and the Village Hall continues to run smoothly. We are grateful for the way in which we are supported by members of the Brundish community and are pleased to contribute to maintaining the Hall as a community asset.

In November 2016, the Brundish website switched over from "onesuffolk" to "suffolk.cloud". We continue to maintain the website on behalf of the Parish Council and the village at no cost.




