

#### A note from Headteacher Mrs Wiseman

#### Bishop's visit

This month (16th May) we were very privileged to be visited by Bishop Mike (the Bishop of Dunwich). He joined us for lunch and then the children sang for him after which he spent time explaining to us all about his role as a Bishop and talked about the history of that role down the ages. He showed us his official clothing and Jewellery and explained why each item is important and what its religious significance is.

One of our pupils, Sammy Pullan (Y6), was dressed by the Bishop (see front cover) and had the opportunity to model the full out-fit for us. He looked rather splendid, even if the mitre was a little on the large side! Bishop Mike explained that in the medieval period it was the practice to dress a child up as a Bishop for the day and to fulfil his duties. This was done to ensure that the Bishop didn't get too full of his own importance. We didn't see any evidence of this in Bishop Michael's case!

Bishop Mike spent time with the children in class talking to them and finding out more about their school and their views on things. We enjoyed his visit immensely and it was clear that this view was reciprocated. The Bishop has written to express his thanks for our hospitality and to comment on the strong positive ethos of our school:

'Classroom discussions showed that the children greatly valued the quality of relationships and the supportive secure space provided by the school....In summary the school strikes me as an excellent example of a Church of England Primary School.' In conversation he complimented the children on their enthusiasm and their confidence and for the tremendous welcome afforded him on his visit.

#### Wilby Brass group and other musical happenings

On May 20th our First Brass Group performed as part of the Horham Village Fete. The children sounded brilliant and a good day was had by all! #### NEWS FROM WILBY PARISH COUNCIL

#### **Annual Parish Meeting**

The Annual Parish Meeting on 3 May 2017 attracted 11 residents who were presented with reports on activity in the village. It was a very encouraging picture with:

- **the school** achieving outstanding academic results and providing a very wide range of life enhancing opportunities for the children consistent with their new motto "*Dream big, Work hard*";
- **the church** continuing to meet the spiritual needs of the community and raising very substantial sums to be found each year to cover clergy and diocesan costs and also to meet significant running costs;
- **the village hall** putting on a wide range of activities to attract all ages with an upcoming summer event and scarecrow competition; and
- **the WI** providing a wide range of events for its members including the experience of the first double amputee to complete the 50 mile desert Marathon des Sables and the role and training of medical detection dogs.

In the public forum concern was raised about the actual availability of superfast broadband and it was felt that this could only be resolved by contacting BT directly. Mobile phone coverage remained patchy with little prospect of improvement.

#### Parish Council Meeting - 10 May 2017

The council was reconstituted with Ian Williamson and David Holliday re-elected as Chairman and Vice Chairman respectively with Councillors Steve Lee and Ian Taylor also remaining in post. We were delighted to welcome two applicants seeking to join the council and a decision on their co-option will be taken at the next meeting in July, following which the full membership of the council will be published.

Council supported a planning application for principally internal alterations at Wilby Manor, Wooten Green and similarly supported a Listed Building application subject to the alterations being consistent with current conservation policy.

Initial consideration was given to how the council could more closely support the village hall. It was agreed that a meeting of the council, village hall and school would be helpful to identify the issues involved and the nature of support required.

Six people have volunteered to join Village Emergency Telephone System (VETS) to provide immediate help to those requiring the defibrillator. Some further details of the system are being clarified with the Community Heartbeat Trust before VETS is formally introduced in Wilby.

The next meeting of the council will be held in the Coronation Hall at 7.30pm on **Wednesday 12 July 2017.** All are welcome to attend.




